- **Position Summary** This position assists the Site Archaeologist with the basic protocols and responsibilities for the cultural resource monitoring and unanticipated discovery and inadvertent discovery plans for the Project. These procedures are to be used if intact cultural material or materials determined culturally significant are discovered or impacted during construction and/or ground disturbing activities associated with the Project. This position is critical during earth-disturbing activities.

Key Functions

- Complete Cultural Monitoring training including:
 - Review of MOA
 - Review of Archaeological Monitoring and Treatment Plan
 - Review of Unanticipated Discoveries Procedures
 - Review of the Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act (NAGPRA) Plan of Action (MOA Appendix D)
 - Pertinent State and Federal laws and regulations
 - Overview of cultural materials that may be found within the Project area
- In collaboration with the Site Archaeologist, monitor ground disturbing construction activities.
- Assist Site Archaeologist in the resolution planning for inadvertent discoveries.
- Serve as local representative regarding cultural resources.
